Dear Praying Friends,

Greetings from the mission field of Croatia! I continue to rejoice in the goodness of God.

God has provided an opportunity for us to purchase a larger building for our “Munchkin Ministry” in the Gypsy village. We've been meeting for years in a hot, cramped shipping container, and now we have the chance to purchase the house next door! The village has hundreds of kids, and we can only squeeze about 50-60 into the container. Fundraising began a few weeks ago, and we are currently \$9,500 away from reaching the purchase price. Please consider helping with this great need. Any amount would be a blessing.

In June, I participated in a free, week long clinic in Romania provided by Medical Missions Outreach (MMO). I worked with the optical department, matching people with used prescription and reading glasses that most closely fit their needs. MMO provides clinics in 3rd world countries in order to draw crowds to hear the Gospel from the local missionaries and church members. It's a wonderful concept. I get to participate in another clinic in August in Moldova. Churches could really help this ministry a great deal by simply collecting and donating used glasses (reading or prescription) and mailing them to

My goal will be to present the work in some new churches, visit supporting churches that I haven't been to in a while, or have not yet visited, plus see my mom and dad, who will be 81 and 85 at that time.
